- C Applicants who will have completed 60 or more hours by the beginning of the next semester **must have completed PSYC 100 and MATH 124, 220 or 234**, and must also have completed or have in progress at the time of application: **AGCM 110, AGCM 210** (for ACES com); and **CHEM 102 and 103** (for ag ed and ag leadership).
- C All applicants for the ag education concentration must have successfully passed the Illinois Certification Testing Service **Test of Basic Skills**. Information about other requirements of the Council on Teacher Education Common Assessment Plan is available at www.cote.uiuc.edu.
